The WA State Junior team (the WASPS) were runners up at the Australian Junior Team Championships last year.

Whilst that was a significant improvement

becoming competitive against the Queensland Sharks, as a Combined team, requires a fresh approach to how we are preparing.

So this year we engaged the services of renowned Aussie coach Roger Flynn and held 3 Performance Camps.

Flynn ran the Victorian Institute of Sport - Squash Unit before becoming the National Coach of Scotland.

Flynn was full of praise for the initiative taken by WA Squash:

"WA Squash undertook a major step up in its preparation of representative teams for the Australian Junior Championships this year.

Bringing players and their coaches from all over Western Australia together on a

regular basis is a logistically difficult task but one that has been embraced this year in order to raise the standard of performances.

A major part of the initiative has been to bring in experts to up-skill local coaches by getting them involved in all aspects of the program - as well as by conducting specific workshops and other updating activities.

The enthusiastic response by both players and coaches has vindicated the innovative approach and with WA players poised to take out many of the national titles, this should send a message to other states about the comprehensive approach taken by WA Squash.

This forward thinking initiative has been supported by significant investment by Healthways, the Department of Sport and Recreation, the Professional Squash Coaches Association of Australia and the Bridgetown Camp School."



GREG CHAN

HONG KONG JUNIOR OPEN CHAMPION

Last month Australia's best U13 junior **Greg Chan** won an International Title when he took out the Hong Kong Junior Open.

That's right ... An Aussie winning an International event! Sadly these days that is a rarity. What captured the attention of many was the way in which Chan did it.

Firstly, Chan was seeded 9-16. Just reaching the semi final was a wonderful achievement. If he lost the semi everyone would have understood given he was facing the #1 seed Malaysian Lim Kai Shan Andrik.

Fortunately, Chan isn't overawed by seedings or reputations. He just gets on the court and does his "thing". So when he beats the #1 seed 11-9, 11-9, 11-5 people stand up and take notice. What a fantastic achievement!

If that was as far as Chan went then once again everyone would have been delighted. If he was going to win the final he would basically have to repeat his last performance against the second string Malaysian Chandaran Ameeshenraj who was seeded #2.

Chan began well taking the opening game 11-6. But suddenly, Chan had a fight on his hands when he lost the next two games narrowly 9-11, 10-12. Facing the prospect of having to reverse the trend Chan began to slowly but surely take control of the match and grind out a magnificent win 11-4, 11-4 to take the title.

Chan's coach is Sue Hillier. Understandably, Hillier is very proud of Chan's achievements and pleased the family chose Vic Park.

Chan's Mum Ping said "We chose Vic Park Squash because the club was referred to us by a squash friend. Also knowing that Sue Hillier was the resident coach and WA Squash Junior Development Officer, we believed it would be a strong club for the development of young players."

The family came to WA in early 2014. Greg is the youngest of 4 children. Later in that same year, Chan won his first major title becoming the U11 Australian Junior Champion and he hasn't looked back.

Chan's Mum Ping said they chose Perth "because it is the most beautiful city in Australia. The weather is perfect except the few extremely hot summer days. The city is just the right size for a conducive family life".

Chan's coach was full of praise for her young charge "As a coach what stands out the most for me is that Greg has a great temperament on the court whether he wins or loses, he always has a smile, which is rare for someone so young".

"It is obvious Greg enjoys playing the game, he focuses on how he plays and the risks he takes not on the actual outcome. His game is not the usual up and down the wall, which is what makes him stand out".

"He is now playing in our Vic Park inhouse competition against the adults having worked his way to the #1 position in the team. The #2 players are happy that Greg and our other juniors have moved up to the #1 position. It is quite difficult for someone so young to be able to handle winning and losing to adults, he does this so well that his has earned respect from his opponents. A great achievement these days".

"As a coach I am working on Greg's discipline, whilst ensuring he can still play the way he likes. The difficulty as a coach is to make sure that he keeps enjoying the game and doesn't burn out by the time he is 18. Remember he is only 13 years old".

Chan is now preparing for the Australian Junior Championships in Sydney in September.




