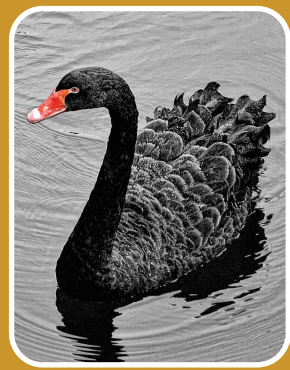

*The office has taken steps to implement the new 'umbrella model' after it was unanimously voted in. In a couple months, we will reach out to the non-affiliated clubs to try to get them under the umbrella, as well as individual players into the new 'virtual club', so they too can compete and hopefully eventually join or establish a local club.*

*The approved Constitution amendments have been lodged with DMIRS, and once approved, will be accessible via our website.*

## Revo

*As with any new programs, there are teething issues. Whilst Revo has been spoken about for almost two years, we have really only been pushed to use it in its entirety since January 2025, ie. four months. We are thrilled to have almost 1,800 members on the system, many of which are using it on a daily basis.*

*The support crew at Revo are working on fixing the larger issues which are having the most impact on those using it, and where we are currently having to create workarounds. Whilst we have not yet been given a date, we have been told weeks, not months, and I will keep everyone informed as I hear more. In saying this, Revo is being used for Tournaments and various pennant/league/inhouse competitions across the state. So, it IS working, just not as efficiently as we would like.*

*When we implemented Revo there was a lot of push back, as having pro rata fees was not an option. We have since achieved this, and all states/territories, clubs and players are happy with this progression.*

*An element currently being investigated is a one-off event fee for those who only play the odd tournament. Whilst this may take a while to come into effect, much like the pro rata membership fees, work is well underway on this!*

*A number of our valued members have been contacting the office lately, unable to register for an event after signing up to an additional, second club. There is absolutely no issue in doing this, however during this process it is vital that you sign up at the SAME level of membership as you hold with your Primary Club.*

## Example scenario:

*John holds a 'Local' membership with Belmont Saints Squash Club and starts playing in the Vic Park in-house competition. He wants to receive Vic Park's news and updates so heads to their Revo membership portal to join them as a secondary club.*

*During the registration process, John chooses a 'Digital' membership. He doesn't realise that his entire membership level has been downgraded to Digital.*

*The next day John tries to register for the WA Open but sees there are no registration types showing for him to choose from, so contacts the office. Office staff discover John's membership level is at 'Digital' so they perform an upgrade to get him back up to 'Local', as that is the minimum membership level required to play in Squash WA events.*

*The annual Squash Australia Camp was run at Squash WA Centre, Belmont on Friday 4 April – 6 April.*

*HP Manager Lachlan Johnson and Coaches Jenny Duncalf (former World No 2) and Ryan Cuskelly (former World No 12) helped our Performance Squad players improve their games.*

*We started Friday night with the Squash Australia Next Generation players Teagan Scott and Alex Marsh getting a one-on-one with the coaches.*

*Saturday saw 9 of our Performance Squad players attend working on:*

- Accuracy/consistency (playing & training with intensity) in the morning session*
- Playing with pace/cutting the ball off during the afternoon session*
- Coach Tim Cowell stepped on court to assist with the learning by setting the pace and accuracy.*

*After their morning session the coaches made time to coach our Talent Squad along with Lisa Christou and myself working on volleys. Setting up some easy routines, then utilising this in game play. From there they went to coach the Youth Squad alongside Dave Fear and Leigh Kaye working on good basics.*

*Whilst this was happening the Performance players got sustenance and a chance to rest before the afternoon session.*

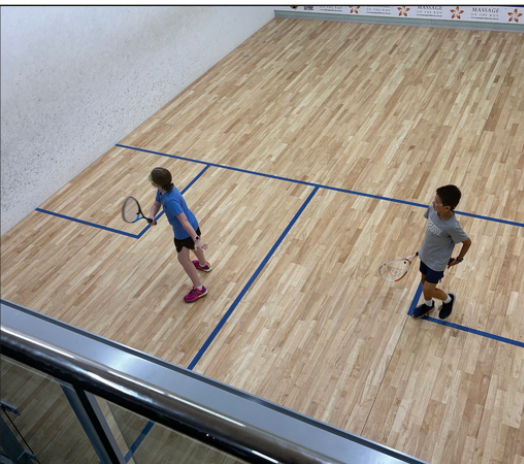

I have owned an engineering workshop for most of my adult life and during that time it became obvious there was a need for an inexpensive, effective and environmentally friendly way to clean workshop parts.

Being a cold wash it's inexpensive and easy to operate, and using a degreaser as the cleaning agent lowers your parts clean and ready to use after one wash only. Even with a heavy workload, servicing is significantly reduced with Warthog, compared to a water-based hot wash.

In addition to designing and building an effective parts washer, it was also vitally important for me to keep running costs to a minimum while still being eco-friendly. This meant a 30-gallon degreaser needed to be created - and with that in mind I formulated EcoClean.

I designed and built my own distiller so that oil used degreaser collected from workshops when servicing would be treated, reused and recycled. This process has meant a cheaper degreaser for the client and an environmentally sound product as no waste generated from the distilling process is collected and recycled.
