#### **OUR PSA PLAYERS**

**Zac Alexander** has begun another winning streak winning the North Coast Open in Coffs Harbour. It was his 5th PSA Title for the year. Alexander will start favourite to win the Queensland Open and Mackay Open in October.

**Lisa Camilleri** was runner up to Tamika Saxby at the North Coast Open before traveling to China to participate in the W10 China Challenge Cup. Camilleri lost in the QF to Vanessa Chu 7-11, 4-11, 11-9, 4-11.

Rachael Grinham had to qualify for the rich Al-Ahram International at the famous Pyramids of Giza in Egypt. Unfortunately, Grinham's progress was halted in Round 1 by World Champion Nour El Sherbini 11-7, 11-4, 11-4 (23m)

**Matt Hopkin** returns to Australia and has been installed as the #3 seed in the Queensland Open. Hopkin won two PSA titles overseas this year and will be aiming to win his first title on home soil since breaking through for his first title success at the Shepparton International in August 2014.

**Solayman Nowrozi** returned to some form after 1st round exits at his previous 4 PSA events. Nowrozi reached the Quarter Finals of the North Coast Open with a good win over Nick Calvert 3-11, 11-5, 11-9, 11-6 (39m).

**Jessica Turnbull** reached the semi finals of the North Coast Open. Despite leading 2-1 against Lisa Camilleri, Turnbull couldn't put the evergreen Camilleri away losing a close contest 9-11, 11-3, 11-4, 10-12, 10-12 (45m).

Solayman Nowrozi achieved a new HWR. Joel Luca achieved a new HWR.



## *Q SQUASH NEWS*PSA M5 Q OPEN PREVIEW

World #90 **Josh Larkin** is the #1 seed for the Queensland Open but will need to lift his performance considerably to win the title.

#2 seed and defending champion Zac Alexander will start a red hot favourite given his track record against the #1 seed. Alexander has also won 5 PSA titles on the PSA Tour this year compared to Larkin's one.

Alexander (World #92) has met Larkin in 3 finals in the past 12 months and beaten him 3-0 on all three occasions. Larkin's best result was a 10-12, 8-11, 12-14 (46m) scoreline at the Mackay Open last year.

At the 2015 Queensland Open Alexander won 11-7, 11-5, 11-9 (37m) and at the recent North Coast Open the result was similar with a fairly comfortable 13-11, 11-4, 11-2 victory.

Great to see Matt Hopkin has returned to Australia. The 25 year old has won 2 PSA titles this year.

Hopkin recently won the Black Sea Open where he beat #3 seed Patrick Rooney (ENG) in the semi final 8-11, 13-11, 11-7, 14-12.

Given the closeness of the scores, Patrick Rooney is more than capable of causing an upset or two.

The talented 19 year old reached the quarter finals of the World Juniors in 2015 and recently won the Madeira International Open in Portugal beating the #1 seed and World #85 Shehab Essam (EGY) in the semi final.

## *Q SQUASH NEWS*PSA W5 Q OPEN PREVIEW

**Tamika Saxby** is the #1 seed for this year's Queensland Open. Given her form this year (5 PSA titles so far) she looks set to continue her winning ways.

The World #57 is closing in rapidly on a new career high. In July 2012 Saxby achieved her highest World Ranking at 55.

Standing in her way are Lisa Camilleri, Amanda Landers Murphy and Jessica Turnbull.

Camilleri has met Saxby on 4 occasions this year including 3 finals and is yet to post a win. Camilleri's best result was at the Sandgate Open where she pushed Saxby to four. The former World #28 (May 2011) is more than capable of causing an upset but needs a softer run into the finals. She has run into Jessica Turnbull a number of times in the lead up matches and despite winning those encounters has used up a lot of fuel in the process.

Kiwi Amanda Landers Murphy is the "smokey" of the field. The former World #35 is more than capable of a bold showing. She and partner Joelle King recently won the World Doubles Championship against Rachael Grinham and Donna Urquhart.

Queensland's Jessica Turnbull could cause an upset if she gets a good run through. The World #83 recorded her best result this year reaching the final of the Bendigo International. In the final, Turnbull lost to Egyptian Hana Ramadan 6-11, 4-11, 11-9, 9-11 (36m).

Turnbull gave Saxby a big scare at the South Australian Open when in round 1 she pushed the eventual winner all the way to lose narrowly 12-10, 5-11, 7-11, 11-6, 8-11 (48m).



## **Q SQUASH TALKS TO ALEX EUSTACE**

"The most important thing for any youngster is to have fun and to remember when you're young winning and losing isn't everything ... it's how you play the game that counts."

What great advice from Australia's #1 junior Alex Eustace.

Eustace won his first State Title in 2010 when he won the 13YAG Queensland Championship.

That win effectively got the "monkey" off his back in terms of winning his first major title. Finally, he could say he was a State Champion! In that same year he finished runner up at the Australian Junior Championships.

It then took him 5 years to win his first National title when he won the U19 Boys Championship in 2015.

The main turning point for Eustace was the time he spent with former World Champion Rodney Eyles on the Gold Coast.

"He focused on building a strong physical base and increasing my intensity in training and in my work ethic" said Eustace as he reflected on how his game developed under Eyles.

That training certainly paid off with Eustace winning the 2014 Australian Junior Open Championship (U17) and a "double" at the 2014 Queensland Junior Championships (U17 and U19 titles).

In September 2015 representing Australia Eustace and Doubles team mate Joseph

White, won a Silver Medal at the Commonwealth Youth Games in Samoa.

Eustace then won his first National title beating South Australia's Alex Oswald 6-11, 11-9, 11-9, 7-11, 11-7 in 74 minutes!

2016 began brilliantly and just got better and better. The year began with a win in the U19 Oceania Championship against Alex Oswald 11-6, 11-8, 11-7 in 45 minutes.

This was followed by a high quality performance to beat Kiwi Scott Galloway at the Australian Junior Open Championships in Devonport. Eustace won 12-10, 11-4, 8-11, 11-9 in 44 minutes and cemented his place in the Australian Junior Team as the #1 player to contest the World Junior Championships in Poland.

It was time to get super serious and do some intensive training in preparation. So it was off to Orlando to spend some time with another squash legend. This time it

was former world champion David Palmer.

"I went over there for one purpose and that was to train, eat and sleep with no distractions just 100% focus on a high work ethic. The training I did was quite similar to what I do in Australia but I had more exposure to hitting with top 30 players in the world and also the knowledge and experience of David Palmer helping me with my game."

Eustace returned to Australia to win his 5th Queensland State Title before jetting back overseas to represent Australia at the World Championships. He won the U19 State title at the QJC against Jon van der Kreek in three 11-9, 11-7, 11-8.

Playing in your first World Junior Championship is exciting and daunting at the same time but Eustace gave it his all

and led by example.

He bowed out of the individual championship in the 3rd round but it was his performances in the teams that helped Australia achieve its best result since 2002.

Eustace won 3 and lost 3 but his win in four against the French #1 on the opening day caught the eye. (France was seeded #3).

Then despite losing against the eventual team champions Pakistan, Eustace got to play on the all glass show court in the quarter finals ... an experience he will never forget!

Finally, to cap off a memorable week Eustace defeated Jamie Oakley 13-11, 11-6, 5-11, 11-4 on the last day to steer the Aussie team to victory 2-1 against the Kiwis to grab 7th place.

Eustace enjoyed the experience immensely - "The whole experience was fantastic. Seeing the best of the best play and play against some of them was just awesome!

The best players are so inspirational. Just how good their creativity was and their soft touch, which gives them all that much more control over their short game.

The highlight match would have to be beating New Zealand's number 1 in the 7th and 8th play off in the teams securing us the 7th position".

Eustace is now preparing for his last

Australian Junior Championships where he hopes to defend his title and finish his junior career on a high. (**UPDATE**: Eustace has just won the 2016 U19 title)

Although he has played a number of PSA events, Eustace will concentrate fully on building his world ranking and recording as many wins as possible on the Australian Squash Tour.

Eustace is in good hands with Zac Alexander and Nathan Turnbull coaching him.

"I try to train between twice and three times a day, six days a week. This includes up to 8 hitting sessions, 2 running sessions and up to 3 strength and conditioning sessions".

Quick Questions

Has there been any player you particularly admire in squash? In sport?

I do enjoy watching Fares Dessouki and Karim Abdel Gawad playing as well as old videos of Karim Darwish and Thierry Lincou. Outside of squash I admire Roger Federer.

What is your favourite shot? What is your strength?

Volley drop. My volleys, I try to volley everything I can. Also my fitness

"I'm looking at putting in a good off season to start off next year strong in the PSA events".

Eustace has the squash skills and physical ability to endure the rigors of the PSA World Tour.

He will start in Australia but will most likely need to move overseas to get the competition and experience on a regular basis to fast track building his World Ranking.



If at 25 you decide the PSA World Tour is not for you what do you think you might do?

I would like to coach and help bring up the Australian juniors and start up my own personal training.
