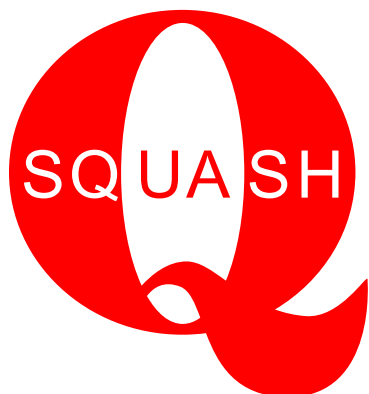

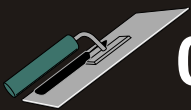

The right move



PREVIEW ONE



Queensland's **Zac Alexander** is set to defend his Mackay Open squash title he won last year. The 27 year old is in sensational form having already won five PSA titles this year including the recent North Coast Open at Coffs Harbour.

Seeded #1 for the event the World #92 should cruise into the final but will need to watch the foreign invaders who might rise to the challenge.

Before competing in the Mackay Open many of the players will participate in the Queensland Open at Nerang on the Gold Coast from 20-23 October. Alexander also won that event last year and is a red hot favourite to do it again.

Alexander's main threat in the Mackay Open is expected to be Patrick Rooney. Seeded #3 the talented 19 year old from England reached the quarter finals of the World Juniors in 2015 and recently won the Madeira International Open in Portugal beating the #1 seed and World #85 Shehab Essam (EGY) in the semi final.

NSW's **Tamika Saxby** is the #1 seed for the women's Mackay Open. Like Zac Alexander the talented Aussie has already won five PSA titles this year including the recent North Coast Open at her home courts in Coffs Harbour.

The 23 year old is on top of the World having just been named in the Australian team to compete at the World Women's Team Championships in Paris later this year.

The World #57 should be too good for her rivals but will need to watch Kiwi Amanda Landers-Murphy. The former World #35 is more than capable of a bold showing. She and partner Joelle King recently won the World Doubles Championship against Australia's Rachael Grinham and Donna Urquhart.

Queensland's Jessica Turnbull could also cause an upset if she gets a good run through. The World #83 recorded her best result this year reaching the final of the Bendigo International in July.

Turnbull gave Saxby a big scare at the South Australian Open when in round 1 she pushed the eventual winner all the way to lose narrowly 12-10, 5-11, 7-11, 11-6, 8-11 (48m).

A number of players including locals will participate in the qualifying rounds on Thursday where four players will advance to the final draw of 16 players to compete for prizemoney totaling USD5,000.



PREVIEW TWO



The Mackay Open Squash Championships will get underway tomorrow at the Mackay Leisure Centre with PSA qualifying matches commencing at 10am.

The Men's Draw will see 16 players battle it out over two rounds of qualification for the final 4 spots available in the main draw. Local eyes will be on Ben Courtice, Darren Dyer, Andrew Ollett, Joel Thompson and Jayden Wadd as they look to advance in the Championship.

In the Women's Draw there will only be one qualifying round. The 4 winners will then progress to the main draw. Mackay's Carman Abad, Tiffany Loss, Rachel McDermott and Teagan Ollett will be waving the local flag. At least one local player is guaranteed to reach the main draw. The match up between Abad and Ollett will definitely see a local's name in the main draw.

With the Queensland Open decided last weekend Zac Alexander has firmed even further as the red hot favourite to win his 7th PSA title for the year. After lifting his 3rd Queensland Open title the #1 seed looks set to defend his Mackay Open title he won in 2015.

Alexander's main opposition will be Patrick Rooney from England whom he played in the semi final of the Queensland Open. Rooney clearly demonstrated he is a player on the up having won a 71 minute battle (11-8, 9-11, 12-10, 10-12, 12-10) against Brad Freeme before achieving a respectable result against Alexander losing 8-11, 13-15, 7-11 (42m).

Two matches point to the form of unknown #2 seed Rui Soares from Portugal. Soares went the distance with Rooney in June losing 6-11, 11-6, 11-9, 3-11, 3-11 (41m). He also went to five with Queensland Open semi finalist Matt Hopkin in October 2015.

Having won five PSA titles already this year #1 seed Tamika Saxby will be hoping to make amends after her shock exit from the Queensland Open. Saxby lost the semi final to the eventual winner Amanda Landers-Murphy (NZ) in four but the scores were close. The final result saw the Kiwi win 11-9, 11-5, 9-11, 11-9 in 52 minutes.

It won't be an easy task for Saxby to reach the final with Landers-Murphy and Queensland Open runner up Milnay Louw (RSA) on her side of the draw. The semi final could see a repeat of the Queensland Open final where Landers-Murphy had to fight back from 0-2 down to beat Louw 7-11, 11-13, 11-9, 11-7, 11-9 (56m).

Keep an eye out for Jemyca Aribado from the Philippines. The 23 year old is a relatively newcomer to the PSA World Tour and she is making waves. Aribado reached the semi finals of the Queensland Open with a 3-11, 11-7, 11-9, 13-11 (40m) victory over #2 seed Lisa Camilleri.

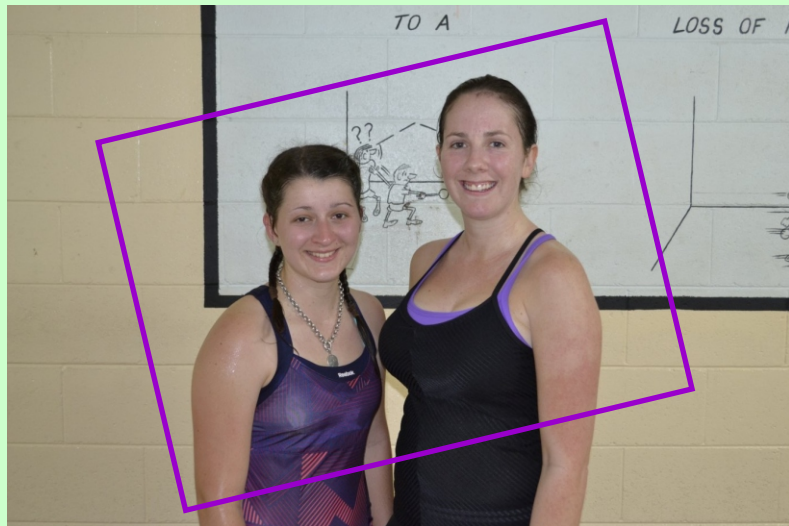

ROUND ONE



There was plenty of action on Day 2 of the PSA Mackay Open Squash Championships with 24 matches played in all: 16 in Round 1 and 8 Quarter Final matches. Spectators were treated to some high quality squash.

South African Jean-Pierre Brits caused the biggest upset of the day when he destroyed the #2 seed Rui Soares from Portugal in Round 1. After a tight opening game which Brits secured 12-10 it was downhill from there with the unseeded Brits winning the next two games with relative ease 11-4, 11-6 in 38 minutes.

The 25 year old from Pretoria is ranked 275 in the World with a career high #151 back in Dec 2014. That is 141 places below his opponent Soares, who is ranked 134. It just goes to show that rankings are just numbers! They don't always predict the outcome.

Brits will now take on Aussie Darcy Evans who caused his own upset in the first round. The Tasmanian who is ranked #259, compared to his opponent #8 seed Joel Luca at #233, was simply too good winning 3-0 in 27 minutes.

The Top 8 seeds in the PSA W5 event went through to the Quarters unscathed.

QUARTER FINALS



In the longest match of the day #5 seed Manuel Wanner won the "Battle of Switzerland" when he beat his higher ranked countryman #4 seed Dimitri Steinmann in four.

Wanner is currently ranked #174 in the World compared to Steinmann at #154. It was sweet revenge for Wanner who lost in three to Steinmann back in April at the Pilatus Cup in Switzerland. On that occasion it was a qualifier Steinmann upsetting the #6 seed Wanner.

Wanner now plays giant killer Jean-Pierre Brits from South Africa. This clash is shaping up to being a fairly even contest.

Men's #1 seed Zac Alexander took his current winning streak to 10 matches in a row straight after beating #7 seed Solayman Nowrozi in straight.

He now plays #3 seed Patrick Rooney in a repeat of the Queensland Open semi final. On that occasion Alexander won 11-8, 15-13, 11-7 in 42 minutes.

Based on World Rankings and Alexander's career high #36, the 27 year old should have the experience and class to win in straight but 19 year old Rooney is on the rise and his Queensland Open performance was full of merit.

This time Rooney hasn't had the energy sapping match he had with Brad Freeme (71 minutes) prior to meeting Alexander so this will be his best opportunity to gauge where he's at compared to the Aussie star.

The Women's Quarters saw #1 seed Tamika Saxby up against Queensland Open runner up Milnay Louw. Saxby won a tight contest in four over 45 minutes. Taking nothing away from Saxby's win but Louw's unforced error count was particularly high when it came to her return of serve. Saxby's confidence is improving.

Saxby has now set up a semi final clash with Queensland Open champ Amanda Lander's-Murphy. At the Queensland Open the Kiwi beat the Aussie in the semi final in four close games 11-9, 11-5, 9-11, 11-9 (52m).

#2 seed Lisa Camilleri was definitely on a mission of destruction when she beat #7 seed Samantha Foyle in a very quick 12 minutes: 11-6, 11-8, 11-7.

Camilleri now plays Jessica Turnbull in the other semi. The last time these two met was in the semi final at the North Coast Open in Coffs Harbour where Camilleri won a classic contest 11-9, 3-11, 4-11, 12-10, 12-10 in 45 minutes.

Both semi finals promise to be hotly contested! Results could go either way.

SEMI FINALS



#1 seed Zac Alexander is safely through to his 7th PSA final for the year after beating England's Patrick Rooney.

W#83 Alexander stepped it up a gear and gave the young Englishman a lesson in top line squash. The 27 year old simply had too many answers beating the 19 year old convincingly in three in 33 minutes.

With 6/6 titles this year Alexander will start a red hot favourite to defend his Mackay Open title and win his 7th PSA title for the year. He will meet #5 seed Manuel Wanner from Switzerland who is currently ranked W#174.

Wanner used up a lot of energy beating unseeded Jean-Pierre Brits (RSA) in three in 66 minute. That is a long time for a 3-0 result.

#1 seed Tamika Saxby improved on her Queensland Open semi final effort against Kiwi Amanda Landers-Murphy but couldn't convert the result into a victory. The Queensland Open Champion was too good again for Saxby winning in five in 46 minutes.

Landers-Murphy will now take on Tully's Lisa Camilleri who has been flying under the radar. Camilleri had a strong win against #4 seed Jessica Turnbull to reach her 6th PSA final for 2016.

Lander's-Murphy will start the favourite but don't be surprised if Camilleri causes an upset.

CHAMPIONS



#1 seed **Zac Alexander** has become the Mackay Open Champion for the 2nd year in a row. The victory took his PSA record to 7 titles this year.

Ranked W#83 Alexander had too much fire power and defeated #5 seed Manuel Wanner from Switzerland (W#174) in straight.

"It was the best I have concentrated over the past 2 weeks so I'm pleased because that was important especially in the 2nd game when Wanner began to dig his heels in" said the champ.

Alexander began a winning streak in August 2015 when he took out the NSW Open. He then won 30 professional matches in a row and collected 7 PSA titles. He then entered the Australian Open and won his first round match but then fell to Kiwi Paul Coll in the second round.

"Maybe I shouldn't have played the Australian Open" Alexander joked after acknowledging he was building yet another impressive winning streak. Since that solitary loss the 27 year old has been undefeated in 12 matches and collected 3 PSA titles.

Alexander won the Queensland Open last weekend, the Mackay Open today and he looking forward to completing the "Triple Crown" by winning the inaugural Cairns International next weekend.



Kiwi **Amanda Landers-Murphy** is the 2016 Mackay Open Champion after defeating #2 seed Lisa Camilleri in four.

"I'm happy to get the win and I'm enjoying my time in Queensland" said Landers- Murphy after her victory.

She only had respect for her opponent "I always knew it was going to be a tough match especially with Lisa's experience. She doesn't give you much to work with and she can put it away if you give her the opportunity".

Landers-Murphy came through on the harder side of the draw and survived a brutal semi final match against #1 seed Tamika Saxby. "Yesterday was a tough win in five because it was very hot on court. I'm not used to the ball bouncing so much! Today was a little better but it was a different style of match" said Landers-Murphy.

The talented 25 year old from Rotorua in New Zealand is currently W#78 but that will soon change following a victory last weekend at the Queensland Open and today's win.

She now heads up to Cairns for the Cairns International where she too will be hoping to achieve the "Triple Crown" winning 3 Queensland PSA events over 3 weekends in a row.
